Overview

Midwest Multicultural Association Inc (MWMA) was incorporated in 2008 and recognised by local government as the voice of the multicultural community.

Key annual community events facilitated by MWMA are Harmony Day (to be known as the Harmony Festival from 2019) in March and Festival of Lights in November.

The Festival of Lights, an accessible, free, cultural community celebration, was held at the Geraldton Multipurpose Centre, Stow Gardens, Geraldton on 10 November 2018.

The celebrations showcased multicultural music and entertainment on stage from 5pm and culminating with ZAP Circus, an internationally acclaimed duo performing their 'Circus Fire Spectacular' as a prelude to the grant finale of fireworks from the Esplanade.

The Festival of Lights or Diwali has been celebrated by the Indian Community in Geraldton for nearly 10 years. In the last five years the event has been hosted by the MWMA and held in public open space for the whole community to enjoy as a celebration of culture.

With representatives from more than fifty different cultures in the Midwest, the 2018 Festival of Lights celebration emphasised and celebrated the rich cultural diversity of the Midwest region with a variety of cultural food, activities and performances.

Evaluation

The event was assessed by the public, stall holders as well as the committee undertaking a SWOT (Strength, Weaknesses, Opportunity and Threats) analysis. In essence:

From the public evaluations, most were made aware of the event via social media or friends; all commented that the venue was great, food stalls and entertainment were enjoyed by their families especially *Circus Fire Spectacular*. Suggestions for improvement included: more stalls selling items with 'lights'; better lighting and more area for people to sit with better seating arrangement as some of the audience were struggling to see performers.

Stall holders on the whole were happy with the balance of stalls. For some stall holders it was a challenge to get their vans on site due to the bollards on the footpath as well as being a tight squeeze to get into their allocated area.

Suggestions for improvement included: allocated loading bay near the event area for stall holders to pick up and drop off if necessary during the night; reduce the site fees to encourage more stall holders; have vans enter event area in order of their allocated space to reduce congestion; recycle bins for cans & water bottles; stalls providing cooked foods to use paper or bamboo containers in place of plastic tubs with lids; more seating required; enforcement of no smoking at this family event.

The Festival of Lights committee recommendations for 2019:

Promotion	Radio interviews on 3 stations RadioMAMA/ABC/Spirit FM for president and headline act in lead up to event
	Brief photographer on importance of names on photos and required photos i.e. of sponsor banners
	Advertise BYO chair/blanket
	Advertise event as no smoking and no alcohol
	Provide written program for patrons
Funding – Grants & Sponsors	Build relationships with sponsors to enhance their experience with MWMA and event
	Corporate area successful - to be continued
	Ensure all City of Greater Geraldton event requirements in place well in advance, especially for fireworks
Infrastructure	Continue to work with electrician regarding power requirements for stall holders as two large generators were required in 2018
	More seating required for patrons - at least 250 chairs
Participation:	Partner with other community groups to assist with set up/pack down e.g. members of Mormon organisation have offered to do community service in 2019
	Review method of getting stall holders on/off site
- · · ·	Review power charges, possibility to pay by requirement e.g. 15 amps could be \$15 rather than a flat rate of \$25 regardless of how many outlets required
Stalls	Tagging of power cords, if undertaken on site, to be charged direct to stall holder
	Early payment of fees to ensure stall holders are committed to turn up
	Onsite briefing for stall holders prior to the event

	Performers agreements with names, performance time, permission to take photos to be implemented
	Detailed run sheet for MC to ensure all tasks undertaken e.g. giving out Thank you certificates to performers
	More interactive activities e.g African drummers invited public up on stage to dance, which was very successful
Program	Invite more Aboriginal entertainers to be a part of the celebrations
	Advise performers where Corporate area is located - possibility of them acknowledging sponsors as part of their performance
	Fence off activities such as sand painting to provide sole use of area by artist
	MC to advertise events such as pony rides and bouncy castle which were outside of the main event area
